is a project initiated by the artist Gunter Demnig to remember all people who were persecuted under the National Socialist regime.

What are Stumbling Stones?

Stumbling Stones are 10x10cm concrete cubes with an upper surface made of engraved brass. Beginning in the year 1992, the artist Gunter Demnig has installed them in 26 countries. Over 1000 of the small metal plates can be found on the pavements of Schöneberg and Tempelhof. Every Stumbling Stone is made by hand so that the industrial killing by the regime is not followed by an industrially manufactured remembrance stone.

For whom are the Stumbling Stones installed?

Stumbling Stones are laid for all people who were persecuted, disenfranchised, deported or murdered in the Nazi period. The stones list the dates of birth and death of the victims. They are installed in the public space in front of the last voluntarily chosen, self-determined residential address of the respective person.

How can I initiate a Stumbling Stone?

Relatives and sponsors can contact the coordination office of the district to initiate the laying of a Stumbling Stone. We ask for your understanding if the waiting times are longer: Many of those persecuted lived in Schöneberg and only a limited number of stones can be manufactured and laid each year.



How can I support the Stolperstein project?

It is possible to take on a sponsorship for a Stumbling Stone. This means covering the costs of making the stone, doing independent research on the person affected, researching for possible family members who are still alive, and writing a short biography for the Stumbling Stones website. For new sponsorships the coordination office regularly offers advice on how to conduct the research. Interested people are also welcome to form research and sponsoring groups. Another possibility is to conduct archival research work for family members who live abroad and are therefore not able to do the research themselves. Participation in the laying of the stones is also welcome. Relatives are often present when the stones are installed. Helping to organize their visit in Berlin, offering a contribution for a little ceremony, or simply attending the laying of the stone are also ways to support them (and the project).

How can I inform myself about upcoming Stumbling Stone installations?
